I am at last starting to re-work the interior of my C -1. The seats are soft and you sink in. Does anyone have any suggestions for doing anything to stiffen the coil springs? Foam rubber will be added across the top but the springs will still compress too much. Getting in the back seat as you sit on the corner to get in, the seats compress a lot.

Any ideas?

Hi Mike.

I seem to remember a Club member wrote an article on his restoration and in that article he suggested that foam rubber sheeting be cut to the length of the coil springs and then be rolled up and then whilst tightly rolled, he insertyed it into the inside of each coil.

When the roll was allowed to release, it unwound and locked into the inside of the coil springs. This way the upgraded the spring rate of the coils. Cheers,
