



AIRFLOW RESTORATIONS

Phil Putnam and Terry Brinson, Chico California: 1934 Chrysler CU Coupe



Phil and Terry began the restoration on this car in early April. The chassis is now complete except for the gas tank. The motor has been started and all checks out fine; the body/paint work is approximately 40% complete. Nearly all of the parts needed to complete the restoration have been found and await refurbishing, remanufacturing, painting or chroming. Upholstery is tentatively scheduled for September and may take 3-4 weeks because we do not have patterns. But the upholstery shop has done two of these coupes before. We plan to use brown leather. As of this writing, the paint color has not been determined, but we are thinking not black.

John Heimerl, Suffolk Virginia: Airflow projects, past and future

Since 1977, we've had more than a few Airflow projects. A CU sedan, C-1 sedan, SG sedan, two C-2 coupes, a CW Custom Imperial, and finally, now an SG business coupe. At one point we had seven Airflows at home (including a CU parts car and a C-1 parts car), but there are ACA members with more than seven, in some cases a lot more. And with a tip of the hat to those folks, I decided after the last of the C-2 coupes was finally done, and there was a very good offer from a museum - it was time to sell the Imperial Coupe and focus on other cars. Two years later, I had to fix the "no Airflow" problem.



My current project, an SG coupe, came out of the Kleptz collection through Chuck Cochran. Frank Kleptz had two Airflows, a 38,000-mile amateur-restoration SG coupe he got in the early 70's and took to the West Virginia ACA meet, and the famous Major Bowes CW Imperial limousine which he superbly restored. Chuck has a great story about how Frank bought the SG coupe about 5 minutes before Chuck arrived to buy it. Frank passed on a few years back; Chuck was finally able to buy the car from his estate and got it running after decades of museum storage, just in time for the 50th ACA meet. But the years of sitting in the museum had taken its toll. Chuck had fixed the brakes, and did the usual things required after a long sleep. The rest of the car needed more work, and I knew that. I pulled the head and manifolds, pan and pistons. Surprise: the bearings were original standard DPCD parts, and still on-spec. Of course, no disassembly disappoints! Three valve guides were pretty loose, the cylinders had some taper, the exhaust manifold was cracked and the aluminum head was badly corroded.



So "the SG coupe repair cart" pictured is the result, in addition to one of those lovely John Librenjak newly-cast heads, MOPAR NOS Power-Punch Oil-Master rings for tapered cylinders, new valves and guides, and the rest of the stuff required for a complete mechanical refurbishment. For now we just want a reliable driver. And I confess, I am guilty of letting a 2-year refurb of a 1963 Avanti R-2 get in the way. I'll get back on the SG next, I promise. We have to have at least one running Airflow, and we hope you do too!

Peter Dooley, Australia: My Second SE

I purchased this 1934 DeSoto Airflow SE from Club member Cyril Mills's wife Margaret after the sad passing of her husband. At the time I already had an Airflow which had been modified by mounting the body to a 1984 GM Holden pickup chassis to do outback dirt roads in car events for charity (See the yellow Airflow). I wasn't looking for another. A friend in discussion mentioned he had seen an Airflow while inspecting another old car restoration at the Mill's home. The rest is history....



Body and frame were separate when I purchased car. The best way to sum it up is like getting a jig saw puzzle, throwing the bits on the ground then putting the box in the trash. The frame had been restored along with engine and running gear. The body work is now done and painted, so it's just a simple job of assembly....easy one would think... I have waived from the original configuration by installing custom metal floor pans and fitting a 12-volt alternator.

Roger Irland, Phoenix: Progress on my C-17



There are a couple of milestones to report on the long, long road to getting my Airflow ready for prime time. First, I finished and installed the all-new plywood floor. I had most, but not all pieces to use as a guide, though what I had was deteriorated so not quite good enough for a pattern. And, of course, it's not as simple as "measure twice and cut once." There are subtle curves and angles and cutouts and, and, and.... It all came out of one 4x8 sheet of plywood and I'm glad I bought it several years ago before the recent runaway in prices.



The other biggie is I installed the radiator and grille, so it kinda looks like an Airflow. Plumbing the radiator is going to be interesting as it has a postwar iron head with the water outlet on top. I was hoping to have Ernie Petit work his magic on the cooling fan to turn it into a six-blade, but I missed my chance. I'd be curious to know if that has made a notable difference for any who have the six-blade fan.

And so, on to the interior. I haven't yet decided between a full leather or broadcloth for the upholstery. It is nice to get to the point where that's the next step, though.

Kim Forster, Noblesville, Indiana: 1934 SE Coupe & 1936 S2 Sedan



The SE Coupe (left) had the body work started when I bought the car. After I got the car back from being repainted, I installed the brakes, exhaust, wiring, gauge cluster, window glass, and dash knobs. The car is now at the upholstery shop. The fiber board headliner, door panels, and rear panels have been made and are installed. This is a business coupe with solid steel wheels too. I will have the car at the meet in Independence, Missouri in September 2021.

The S2 Sedan (right) was purchased in February 2021. Don't be fooled by the photograph. It's a 20-footer! The car has the original interior and paint. Replacing the delaminated window glass was the first order of business.



The first backward step was finding out that the number 1 cylinder has zero compression unlike 2 through 6 that have 95 psi. We removed the head and found two golf ball size clumps of radiator stop leak in the hole in my head! This will be remedied with a new aluminum head and NOS head gasket. The cooling system, fuel system, and brakes are next. The goal is to have the S2 ready for the DeSoto Club meet at the end of July 2021 in Brookfield, Wisconsin.

Jon Clulow, Pasadena Maryland and John Boyd, San Diego: 1936 Chrysler C11 Sedan



When this formerly very rusty car went into the body shop last January, the first step was to strip the car. We found that the pitted sheet metal really had to be sandblasted to get all the corrosion out of those pits for a good paint job. That done, the body repair was completed and the car was filled and blocked. Next it went to paint. We selected a modern two-stage metallic gray approximation to Winchester Gunmetal. The hardest part, says Armando, was straightening and aligning the hood to get the fit right and the gaps uniform and straight. But we are moving forward! Meanwhile, work on the interior is proceeding. Bluish gray leather seat cushion covers have been fabricated, rear arm rests and bolster covers are also ready, and plans for headliner and



carpet are made. I hope to pick up the replated bright chrome and butler (satin) chrome interior parts this week.

Bruce Wallin, Chico California: 1934 Chrysler CW

CW 7803784 is thought to be the senior surviving example of all the 1934 LeBaron-bodied Custom Imperial Airflows (interestingly, the second-oldest extant CW is junior by only one digit in both its serial and engine numbers).

CWs are a particular challenge to restore because of the size, degree of finish, and rarity of a great number of their constituent parts. This particular CW has been very fortunate to have had the keen interest and generous help of a dozen or more members of the ACA (as well as numerous outside craftsmen and fabricators) to bring it very close to completion after nearly two decades of effort.

The body is done, is in final paint, and has been lowered and bolted onto the rolling chassis, which is also in final form. Secondary parts, such as fenders, spare-tire cover, engine and dash appointments, and electrical assemblies are all completed, as are the oak roof and seat millwork.



The interior is now ready for upholstery, which will be done by the same local craftsman who for some time has had the wool broadcloth and hogs-hair carpet stored in his shop and who, by the way, has done the interiors of two prior CWs.

There is at least one advantage to a multi-year restoration. It provides an opportunity to chase, acquire, and use only correct parts and materials for a perfect end-product. There

have been numerous instances in the course of this restoration to bear this out (such as the contribution of the special, elongated grille spears and unique steering box salvaged by Swedish ACA members from the hulk of the famous CW once owned by the Swedish crown for the use of the royal family, the offering of the unique and oversize CW spare tire cover by an Ohio family that had once owned one of these cars when new, the discovery of a beautiful chrome-laden Deluxe Mopar heater on eBay, and the difficult but successful casting of the 7.5' aluminum running boards by the metal-arts foundry of California State University, Chico).

CW 7803784 does indeed owe a huge debt of gratitude to all the Airflow enthusiasts who have made its miraculous rebirth possible!



David Felderstein, Sacramento: 1936 Chrysler C10 Coupe

With progress previously reported in the *Airflow Newsletter*, my C10 coupe is coming along! The body is again off chassis after a "reconciliation" fitment to check that it's all there and everything




