From John Librenjak, manager, ACA club store:

Dear ACA Board Members:

"I propose we have 100 hubcap skins made so we have an inventory that would last a few years. I will get an estimate on chrome plating to see what the cost would be. At this time, we need to order materials and have the caps made; plating will be a separate charge if we decide to do it.

Background: There have been complaints that the skin chrome plating breaks easily if the new skins are painstakingly bent over the hubcap core as originals were. Some have glued them instead, which makes bending the rim over even harder. If not done, it can become very difficult to remove the reskinned hubcaps because you there is no gap between cap and wheel to insert a prying device into. I don't recommend gluing. It appears it may be best to install the new skins first, and then have them plated. I recommend a discussion about which way to go, but for now, I have found a

place that can spin and stamp the skins. We might later have some plated and sell them for higher cost, depending on discussion still to be held."

Request: Authorize the Club Store to purchase the materials and labor to make the (unplated) skins.

Details: Material: 4- sheets of CDA 1/2 hard brass sheet .020 36x96 86.4 lbs. x \$9.72 per lb. = \$839.81 plus \$73.48 tax totaling \$913.29. Labor to spin and press the Chrysler logo into the skins: \$8.45 per skin x 100 skins = \$845.00

Total material and labor come to \$1,758.29

Any material left over will be used to make 1934-35 DeSoto skins with extra labor cost for those skins.

John adds: We have a small window of time to get these made because the vendor has a large order to fill for the Cheese Cake Factory, (60,000 units). We need to get in front of that order.

February 2, 2020 – 9:41 am Eastern Time - The Board voted unanimously to approve the expenditure of funds.
