

Pattern for S-2 gooseneck is Available if your gooseneck is worn out and needs replacing

I had to have a pattern made for the gooseneck assembly for my 1936 S-2 engine. My gooseneck disappeared in the rehab process a few years ago and **John Spinks** was kind enough to give me one that was usable to make a pattern. I had one made in steel and it is on my car. The other gooseneck is made of aluminum, which I later sent to John.

Fortunately or unfortunately, after spending over \$2,000.00 to have the pattern made, my missing goose neck mysteriously showed up at the restoration shop a year later.

I wanted the membership to know that I have the gooseneck pattern and although I've announced it at a tech session or two, I want anyone who needs to have one made know that I can help with their need. The foundry that made the pattern and made the two goosenecks is in Portland, Oregon, so I can go

directly to them and don't send things through the Post Office.

The goosenecks that I had made are pictured here and they fit perfectly.
